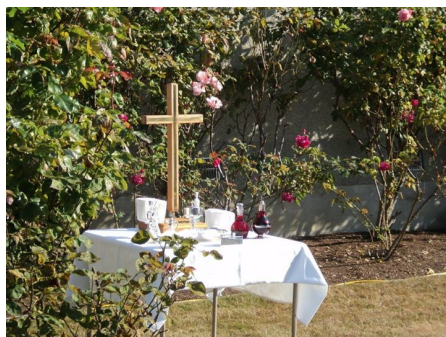
In our community, we pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ of the Seventh Day Adventist Church in Sidney.
